Subject: Covid-19 and Racism

Dear and Rev. Fathers, Rev. Sisters and Brothers and Sisters in the Lord,

Glory to God in the highest! Amen.

As we are aware, we are living in a world of challenges. Two serious challenges we encounter are, Covid-19 and Racism. These are two evils crushing the world at large. Covid-19 is a new pandemic, but Racism has been there among men for centuries.
